The law requires that programs not having sufficient space and resources to accommodate all applicants will accept those applicants best qualified, using rank, ability and achievement test scores as guides, with preference given equally to students residing in the district or in a joint agreement district.

Applicants having the same number of total points will be ranked by the date on which **ALL REQUIRED PAPERWORK** was received in the Kaskaskia College Office of Admissions. All documents must be submitted by January 31 to be considered for the first acceptance date. Students completing applications/documents after January 31 will be considered for acceptance after May 31. Other applicants will be notified of acceptance as openings occur.

Program Admissions Criteria (con't from front)

3. H.S. Transcript, or H.E.S. If you have already submitted an official, final high school transcript, or high school equivalency scores, you are not required to submit again.

6. ENGL **Must have placement in English 101.** Placement is determined by one of the following:
 - ACT English score of 18 or higher within last 5 years
 - SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score of 480 or higher within last 5 years
 - KC Writing Placement (Verbal score of 310 or higher AND Essay score of 3 or higher) within last 5 years
 - Completion of prerequisite course English 100 with a "B" or better within last 5 years
 - Completion of English 101 with a "C" or better within last 5 years
 - High school cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on an unweighted 4.0 scale within last 3 years
 - GED or high school equivalency test score of 165 within last 18 months

7. MATH **Must have placement in Math 102.** Placement is determined by one of the following:
 - ACT Math score of 17 or higher within last 5 years
 - SAT Math score of 460 or higher within last 5 years
 - KC Math Placement (ALEKS score of 14 or higher) within last 5 years
 - Accuplacer Test (QRAS or AAF 250 or higher) within last 5 years
 - Completion of MATH 101 with a "C" or better within last 5 years
 - High school cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on an unweighted 4.0 scale with successful completion of 4th year of math within last 18 months
 - GED or high school equivalency test score of 165 within last 18 months

8. A.A.S. If a prospective student with an A.A.S. degree has not passed the National Board exams within the allotted time or number of attempts, the student is ineligible for full acceptance into the DGMS program. The prospective student will be conditionally accepted, but must provide proof of national certification by July 31. Failure to provide proof will result in student being dropped from program course work.
