The law requires that programs not having sufficient space and resources to accommodate all applicants will accept those applicants best qualified, using rank, ability and achievement test scores as guides, with preference given equally to students residing in the district or in a joint agreement district.

Information about Licensure

Students who complete the program and pass the National Test for Respiratory Therapy are eligible to apply for Licensure which is regulated by the Department of Professional Regulation. The following questions may be asked on the application. **PLEASE READ THEM CAREFULLY.**

A "YES" answer means you should confer with the program coordinator at Kaskaskia College.

- ♦ Have you ever been convicted of or pled guilty or nolo contendere to any criminal offense in any state or in federal court? Please do not give details on minor traffic charges, but do include information relating to Driving While Intoxicated (DWI) charges. *If yes, attach a personal statement describing the circumstances of the conviction and certified copies of court records of your conviction including the nature of the offense, date of discharge, and a statement from the probation or parole office. In general, a criminal conviction by itself does not usually result in denial of licensure.*
- ♦ Have you been convicted of a felony? *In general, a felony conviction by itself does not usually result in denial of licensure.* If yes, have you been issued a Certificate of Relief from Disabilities by the Prisoner Review Board? *If yes, attach a copy of the certificate.*
- ♦ Do you now have any disease or condition that presently limits your ability to perform the essential functions of your profession, including any disease or condition generally regarded as chronic by the medical community, i.e., (1) mental or emotional disease or condition; (2) alcohol or other substance abuse; (3) physical disease or condition? *If yes, attach a detailed statement, including an explanation whether or not you are currently under treatment.*
- ♦ Have you been denied a professional license or permit, or privilege of taking an examination, or had a professional license or permit disciplined in any way by any licensing authority in Illinois or elsewhere? *If yes, attach a detailed explanation.*
- ♦ Have you ever been discharged other than honorably from the armed service or from a city, county, state or federal position? *If yes, attach a detailed explanation.*

All students will be required to have a background check and drug screening upon entry into the program.

6. ENGL **Must have placement in English 101.** Placement is determined by one of the following:
- ACT English score of 18 or higher within last 5 years
 - SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score of 480 or higher within last 5 years
 - KC Writing Placement (Verbal score of 310 or higher AND Essay score of 3 or higher) within last 5 years
 - Completion of prerequisite course English 100 with a "B" or better within last 5 years
 - Completion of English 101 with a "C" or better within last 5 years
 - High school cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on an unweighted 4.0 scale within last 3 years
 - GED or high school equivalency test score of 165 within last 18 months

7. MATH **Must have placement in Math 102.** Placement is determined by one of the following:
- ACT Math score of 17 or higher within last 5 years
 - SAT Math score of 460 or higher within last 5 years
 - KC Math Placement (ALEKS score of 14 or higher) within last 5 years
 - Accuplacer Test (QRAS or AAF 250 or higher) within last 5 years
 - Completion of MATH 101 with a "C" or better within last 5 years
 - High school cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on an unweighted 4.0 scale with successful completion of 4th year of math within last 18 months
 - GED or high school equivalency test score of 165 within last 18 months
